



## Arnold James Dorr Sr.

February 27, 1925 - November 28, 2017

Arnold James “Jimmy” Dorr, Sr. passed away Tuesday, November 28, in Missouri City at the age of 92 years.

Funeral services will be held Friday, December 1, 2017 at 11:00 A.M. in the chapel at Davis Greenlawn Funeral Home in Rosenberg with entombment to follow in Greenlawn Memorial Park. The family will receive friends from 9:00 A.M. Friday until service time.

Jimmy was born on February 27, 1925 in Crowley, Louisiana to George A. Dorr and Rose (Higginbotham) Dorr. He graduated from Esterwood High School and joined the United States Navy on September 29, 1942. During World War II he was stationed in the Asiatic-Pacific on the USS Indiana Battleship as a radar operator achieving the rank of RDM3c. He was honorably discharged on January 6, 1946.

Jimmy returned to his hometown of Crowley and shortly thereafter met the love of his life, Theresa Martin. They were married October 10, 1946. In 1952 he and Theresa, along with their four children moved to Needville, where he managed the Needville Rice Drier for 50 plus years.

He and Theresa were very involved with the Needville Youth Fair and St. Michael’s Catholic Church. He was also a member of the American Legion.

Jimmy is preceded in death by his parents, wife, Theresa, sister, Rose Marie Schmid; brother, George A. Dorr, Jr.; daughter Margaret Rose Hoelewyn; son Arnold James Dorr, Jr., and son, Arthur John Dorr.

He is survived by his daughter, Linda Marie Robison and husband, Kenneth; son-in-law, Kenneth Hoelewyn; daughter-in-law, Sandra Todd Dorr; grandchildren, Thomas A. Hoelewyn, Tamara Robison Burnett, Janet Hoelewyn Roberts, Jarret M.
