Audie Humphries was born to Audie E Humphries and Eddie D Humphries at Santa Anna, TX on January 11, 1934 passed from this life on January 30, 2023 at his home in Pearland Tx. He assisted many farmers across the country with finding seasonal immigrant workers.

Audie retired early from his position to assist his aging parents in their later years. This act was one of the many things that Audie did because of his gentle spirit. He was kind, loving and generous to all he knew. Many years later he reconnected with Shirley after her husband had died. They rekindled the romance that they had known in high school. After their marriage, they enjoyed many years of traveling to see family, camping in their travel trailer and going on cruises with old friends, many of whom were also acquaintances

from their high school. Audie had a lifelong love of hunting and fishing as well as an absolute passion for growing tomatoes and other vegetables. After his retirement he used this passion to provide food for elderly and unfortunate families around the Edcouch/Elsa area. In addition, Audie also collected stamps, arrowheads, and coins. His pride and joy in all was his complete set of Louis Lamour hardbound western stories which he read cover to cover many times over his life. All of these activities he enjoyed until late in life when his failing health made them no longer possible.

Audie Humphries will be greatly missed by his entire family, as well as the entire staff of caretakers at Brookdale Pearland who feel he was one of the most enjoyable residents they have ever had.

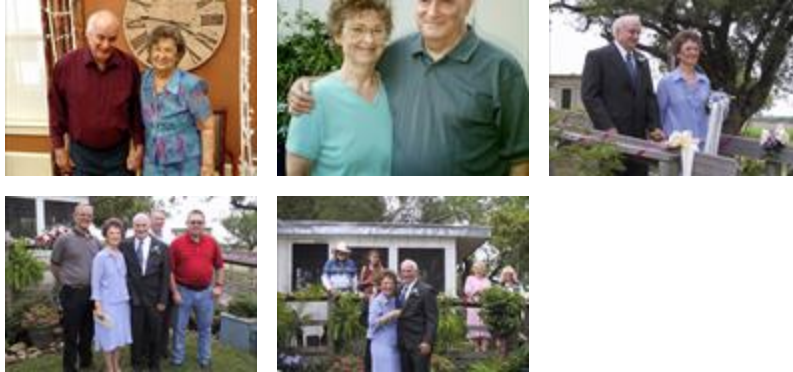
