Bennie "Ben" William Rogge, 87, of Rosenberg, Texas passed away on October 4, 2016. He was born to the late Bennie H. and Clara Meyer Rogge on February 19, 1929 in Brenham, Texas. He met the love of his life, Miss Dorothy Jean Whiddon in Geometry class in 1947 at Brenham High School. They were married on March 17, 1952 at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Brenham, Texas. Ben graduated from Blinn Jr. College and received his BA in Business from the University of Houston. He had a successful 41 year career with General Motors Acceptance Corporation. He and Dorothy relocated several times within the state of Texas as a result of his company promotions. He honorably served our country in the U.S. Navy, during the Korean War, serving on the ship USS Greenwich Bay.

Ben was a long-time member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Rosenberg, there he served as President of the Church Council, taught Sunday School, and always volunteered to work at the annual church BBQ. Ben was an active member of the American Legion Post #271 and V.F.W. Post #3903 in Rosenberg.

After his retirement, his love of the outdoors continued by raising cattle and tending to their 151 Cattle Farm in Chappell Hill. He was most fortunate to have a long and healthy retirement doing the things he loved. Ben always had a beloved pet by his side; many a lucky dog lived a happy life with him and Dorothy.

Of all the things in life Ben loved and cared for, he loved his family the most. They will lovingly hold him in their hearts forever. Ben was a caring husband, father, grandfather, great grandfather and friend who will be missed dearly.
