Betty Jean Turner Hobbs Bell, 90, passed away suddenly and peacefully in her sleep at home in Rosenberg, Texas on June 19, 2018. Betty was born on June 9, 1928 in Lufkin, Texas to Bertha Mae (Scott) and Jessie Vance Turner.
