Boyd Lee Powell, 87, of Sugar Land, Texas passed away on December 25, 2022. He was born on May 16, 1935 in Price, Utah to Sheridan Ray Powell and Dortha Albrechtsen Powell. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics Degree from the University of Utah. Boyd married Virginia Fullmer on August 14, 1961 in the Salt Lake City LDS Temple and together they had four children. They were both long-time residents of El Paso, Texas having moved to the greater Houston area after retirement. This loving father, grandfather, great grandfather, brother, uncle, and friend will be missed.

In addition to his parents, Boyd is preceded in death by his wife, Virginia in June 2016, his brother Glennon Ray Powell and his sisters, Gladys Palmer, Beulah Duncan and Ilean Peterson.

Survivors include his brother, Sherell Powell, and children, Jaime Powell, Joey Powell, Heather Powell Estevez and Jonathan Powell.

Boyd was proud to be grandfather to 14 grandchildren and 1 great grandchild; along with extended family and a host of friends.

Family was very important to Boyd and he made it his life's work to research and document the genealogy of his family. He wrote two books on his family history, based on decades of research. He spread this enthusiasm for family

history by sharing it with others as a family history consultant in the LDS Family History library. He loved helping others to find their families too.

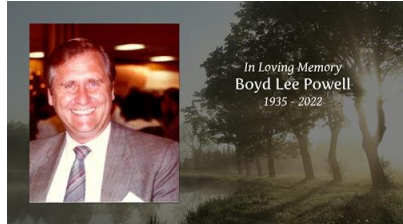
