Her adventures included traveling to Georgetown, Austin, San Antonio, going to the zoo, movies, and the Lamar Consolidated Fillies dance competitions with all the beautiful outfits and routines. Visiting with family and friends always brought a smile, joy and fulfillment to her heart. She expressed endlessly her love for her family and friends.

She moved to Fairchilds in March 1980 with her late husband to be by family.
