The last waltz has been danced, the shuffling of dominoes has stilled and the polka music has faded. What remains is the love and laughter of Charlie Matocha's family and friends.

A funeral mass for Charlie Matocha, 82, of Rosenberg, will be celebrated at 9:30 a.m. Wednesday, May 22, 2013 at Holy Rosary Catholic Church in Rosenberg. Interment will follow at Greenlawn Memorial Park in Rosenberg with Rev. Bill Bartniski officiating.

Visitation will be from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. Tuesday, May 21, 2013 with a Rosary to be recited at 7 p.m. in the Chapel of Davis-Greenlawn Funeral Home in Rosenberg.

Charlie was born September 22, 1930 in Cistern, Texas to Joe and Genevieve Matocha. On February 2, 1953 Charlie married the love of his life, Ila Luedke of New Ulm, Texas.
