



Erik Thomas Garcia

January 22, 1953 - October 28, 2020

With his beloved wife at his side, Erik Thomas Garcia, D.D.S., of Richmond passed away peacefully on Wednesday, October 28, 2020, after battling cancer for almost 5 years. He was born on January 22, 1953, in Poza Rica, Mexico. He grew up in Westford, Massachusetts, before moving to Texas.

From the time he was in high school, he knew his calling was dentistry and he fulfilled his dream when he graduated from the University of Texas School of Dentistry at Houston in 1980. He later earned a Master's degree from the College of Sedation in Dentistry in 2015. Alongside his wife, Rosalia (Rosie) Garcia, he established the Fort Bend Family Dental Center in Rosenberg in 1983. Shortly after establishing his practice, Erik discovered a vocation to provide dental care for the children of the Fort Bend County community and surrounding areas, where he joyously and lovingly served them until 2019. He felt so honored to have served multiple generations of families throughout the years and he loved to attend, alongside his wife, his patients' many family milestones of weddings, baptisms, quinceañeras, and birthdays. He also served on the board of directors for Pregnancy Resource Center in Rosenberg, served on the board for the Medical Missionaries of Divine Mercy of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston, as well as helping other various charitable organizations throughout the community.

Erik was preceded in death by his father Thomas Garcia-Borras of Barcelona, Spain, in 2015 and his younger brother Clifford (Cliff) Garcia in 2001.

Erik is survived by his wife and soulmate Rosie of Richmond, daughter Nyssa Gonsalves (and husband Matthew), daughter Tahsia O'Keefe (and husband Sean), daughter Jonelle Williams (and husband Cory), and seven grandchildren: Thomas O'Keefe, Erik O'Keefe, Maria Estela O'Keefe, Cecilia O'Keefe, Nora Williams, Camila Gonsalves, and Sebastian O'Keefe. He is also survived by his mother, Alia Castellanos Garcia, and sisters Angelica Garcia Flagg and Laureen Garcia.

Erik was most devoted to his faith and his family. He always enjoyed traveling and dining

out with his wife and taking his grandchildren on exciting adventures such as treasure hunting and boating. He will always be remembered for his love of boxing, running, shooting, and fishing.

Visitation will be held from 5:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. with a Rosary at 7:00 p.m., Wednesday, November 4, 2020 in the Chapel of Davis-Greenlawn Funeral Home in Rosenberg.

The funeral mass will be celebrated at 11:00 a.m., on Thursday, November 5, 2020 at St. Theresa Catholic Church in Sugar Land. Burial to follow at Greenlawn Memorial Park in Rosenberg.

Con su amada esposa a su lado, Erik Thomas García, D.D.S., de Richmond, falleció pacíficamente el miércoles 28 de octubre de 2020, después de luchar contra el cáncer durante casi 5 años. Nació el 22 de enero de 1953 en Poza Rica, México. Creció en Westford, Massachusetts, antes de mudarse a Texas.

Desde que estaba en la escuela secundaria, supo que su vocación era la odontología y cumplió su sueño cuando se graduó de la Facultad de Odontología de la Universidad de Texas en Houston en 1980. Más tarde obtuvo una maestría de la Facultad de Sedación en Odontología en 2015. Junto a su esposa, Rosalía (Rosie) García, estableció el Centro Dental Familiar Fort Bend en Rosenberg en 1983. Poco después de establecer su práctica, Erik descubrió la vocación de brindar atención dental a los niños de la

comunidad del condado de Fort Bend y sus alrededores, donde los sirvió con alegría y amor hasta 2019. Se sintió muy honrado de haber servido a varias generaciones de familias a lo largo de los años y le encantaba asistir, junto con su esposa, a los muchos hitos familiares de sus pacientes de bodas, bautizos, quinceañeras y cumpleaños. También sirvió en la junta directiva del Centro de Recursos para el Embarazo en Rosenberg, sirvió en la junta de los Misioneros Médicos de la Divina Misericordia de la Arquidiócesis de Galveston-Houston, además de ayudar a otras organizaciones benéficas en toda la comunidad.

Erik fue precedido en la muerte por su padre Thomas García-Borras de Barcelona, España, en 2015 y su hermano menor Clifford (Cliff) García en 2001.

“ Erik and I were members of the Medical Missionaries of Divine Mercy, Each year during the first week of November a group of 30-40 missionaries would travel to Laredo and the colonias along the Rio Grande to provide dental, medical, and vision services, as well as physical therapy, chiropractic care, spiritual counseling, medications, and eyeglasses to the poor.

Erik was not only a missionary but served on our board of directors and held numerous leadership positions, including chairman of the board. He was a prolific recruiter for the mission and brought in several new dentists to the team. He worked constantly to improve the patient experience, making sure we were providing the best possible and most compassionate care for each patient.

Erik provided free dental care to hundreds of patients over the past 11 years. He relived chronic pain and restored function to people who often suffered for years before they were able to see a dentist. Every fall I would look forward to working as Erik's dental assistant on these trips. Although I had absolutely no training in dentistry or as a dental assistant, Erik was very patient with me, teaching me what I needed to know to help him.

He was invariably kind to all his patients, no matter their circumstance. He cared for them like patients in his own private practice. He was never rushed but always seemed to be on time. It amazed me that he could remember someone from the year before, having only met them that one time. His manner was always kind, gentle, and reassuring, even to the most anxious. Other dentists on the trip would sometimes refer their anxious patients to Erik because they knew he would be able to treat them successfully. He was one of the most humble professionals I've ever met.

On our outreach missions to the smaller colonias along the river sometimes the local people in the community would prepare lunch for us. He would have a few bites, make a satisfying sound, and turn to me and say, "this is really good" or "this is authentic!" He loved the Lord, and he cherished his Catholic faith. Erik loved his family, his wife Rosie, his daughters Nyssa, Tashia, and Jonelle, and his grandchildren. He loved being close to them--physically when possible and emotionally always.

Erik had an interesting ritual near the end of mission week: he would wash all his clothes before he went home. I was always physically exhausted by the end of mission week and would never even think about doing this. But Erik would always find a (working) washer and dryer where we were staying and do his laundry. One time I finally asked him, why do you wash your clothes right before you go home? Why not wait and wash them after you get home? (After all you must have the right change, bring or buy some laundry detergent, etc.) Erik told me he did it because if he took his dirty clothes home, Rosie would take them from him and wash them—and he just wanted to save her the trouble. That is love.

Looking back on the adjectives I have used to describe Erik—kind, humble, gentle, patient, loving, helping the less fortunate—I am describing Jesus, our savior. Erik really did "put on Christ" in his daily life for all to see. This past Sunday was the feast of All Saints--when the church celebrates all the unnamed and anonymous saints in heaven. The Gospel reading was from Matthew's sermon on the Mount. In this discourse, Jesus is telling us who is in heaven: the humble of heart, the merciful, the suffering, those who seek righteousness. Erik lived a life reflecting the beatitudes--I am sure that is why we miss him so much.

At the end of that Gospel reading Jesus said, "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven." Erik is now part of that vast communion of saints, ready to intercede for each one of us. I thank God for his friendship and for all the good work he accomplished in his life.

“ In Memory of my Friend Erik

I honestly don't recall how Erik and I first met, after all it was almost 50 years ago in high school, but we became good friends. Shortly after graduating high school through a series of circumstances, details not important, we became roommates. Specifically,

Erik and I were roommates for about 2 years in our college days (circa 1973-1974) and we pooled our resources with 2 other mutual friends so the rent would be affordable. I recall the rent split 4 ways came to \$30 each for a 2-bedroom 2 bath apartment. Erik and I were fulltime students with part time jobs while the other 2 guys had fulltime jobs with a proclivity for partying at all other times. The apartment was often times "Party Central", with visitors coming and going almost constantly. This created an environment that was not exactly conducive to scholarly pursuits. However, us 2 students found ways to persevere and managed to fit in study time amongst the party atmosphere. Spending a lot of time at the library helped. We had a lot of good times at the apartment and I have many fond memories of that time period.

Perhaps the most memorable was an adventure to Mexico with Erik.

Erik made arrangements for me to accompany him and his uncle on a trip to Mexico. His uncle was a pilot and had his own plane. There was just one little problem. At that time, I had shoulder length hair and it was questionable if I would make it through customs because I looked like a hippy drug dealer. Erik knew I had purchased a short hair wig to hide my long hair under and suggested I wear it to avoid problems with customs. It worked!

We hung out with many of his relatives and friends. I learned that when they told us "mi casa es tu casa" they really meant it. I felt welcomed and at home with everyone I meet. We were driven around by one of Erik's relatives and experienced a lot of the countryside as well as an excursion to Mexico City. At one point while driving in the countryside we stopped at an open-air eatery for lunch. The only thing they served was boiled pigs blood. We both skipped lunch that day. In order to get back home we were faced with a long bus ride which in and of itself was an adventure. Overall, I had a blast even though I don't speak Spanish.

Eventually girlfriends entered the picture and our roommate days with each other ended.

I got married my senior year in college to my one and only wife Valerie and we will celebrate our 46th anniversary next year.

When Rosie came into Erik's life Valerie and I both knew they were meant for each other and we immediately liked her.

We have kept in touch through the years and I remember well my last conversation with Erik where we spoke about the health issues we both were dealing with. Then he told me his grandkids were begging him to take them swimming and he had to go. His priorities were in the right place.

Rosie and your kids and grandkids were truly blessed to have Erik as a husband, father and grandfather and I know you are thankful for the time you had together. As for me...good friends are hard to find and impossible to forget.
