In her later years she did private duty nursing where she got the opportunity of taking care of some really nice people. She worked up into her eighties because of her love for people.

She enjoyed working in the garden, where she grew the best vegetables. Everyone especially loved her tomatoes. Her tender love in care showed in

her garden where she once raised a 100lb watermelon. She was a great cook and her family especially loved her biscuits, and don't forget the mouth watering roast and potatoes. Jellies and jams, pickles, and everything you can canned were always enjoyed by family and friends because she loved to share her cooking.
