Floyd was the kind of friend few people have the good fortune to have in this life.

We could sit and watch smoke drift out of the BBQ pit for hours without saying a word to each other and have the time of our lives. We went to an Oilers game one time with tickets I got at work. Turned out the seats were in the press box and all we could see was from the 45 yard line to the 50 yard line. Didn't matter, we watched what we could see, drank a couple of beers and had fun.

We could laugh at each others mistakes – I remember how amused Floyd was at my “sun burned arms” when I used his arc welder with a short sleeve shirt on and how I laughed until I cried watching Floyd deal with a fire he started by testing his propane tank for leaks with a match.

We also had a friendly rivalry of sorts. I built a BBQ pit out of a 5 foot piece of 16 inch pipe. Well, the next thing I knew, Floyd call me over to inspect his latest purchase. I wasn't surprised to see an 8 foot piece of 36 inch pipe and a five foot piece of 48 inch pipe. ”Leo”, he said “ can you help me figure out how to make this stuff into a BBQ pit?” “Sure, no problem” I said, and you know the rest.

As a neighbor. As soon as I got to know Floyd, he installed a gate in the fence between our back yards as it was too much trouble to ring the front door bells when we needed to see each other or to borrow something. I knew I was welcome to use anything he had and he had every tool you could think of – his favorites were a 24 inch screw driver, a BIG hammer and a 18 inch pair of slip joint pliers and he knew he was welcome to use any thing I had or to ask me to use his tools to solve one of his problems.

Floyd was always there when you needed him and never ask for anything in return.

Floyd never made excuses, never told me a lie and never let me down.

Floyd was my best friend.
