June 22, 1910 - July 11, 2008

Genevieve Kopycinski Cegelski passed away July 11, 2008, at the age of 98. She passed peacefully in her sleep after a brief illness.

She was born June 22, 1910 in Chappell Hill, Texas, the second child of Helen and Frank Kopycinski. In 1928, she moved with her family to the A. P. George Ranch where her father and relatives worked for the George family. In 1930, she married Max Cegelski of Chappell Hill. They married at Holy Rosary Catholic Church in Rosenberg and they lived the first five years of their marriage in Chappell Hill. In 1935 they moved by wagon to Rosenberg to farm and raise their family, remaining in Rosenberg the rest of their lives.

Genevieve is preceded in death by her husband of 58 years, Max Cegelski; her parents, Helen and Frank Kopycinski; her brothers, Max and Alphonse Kopycinski; and her sisters, Verna Kopycinski and Kazmyra Townsend.

She is survived by her sons, T.J. Cegelski and wife, Dorothy of Branson, Missouri, Daniel Cegelski and wife, Anita, of League City, Ed Cegelski and wife, Lynette, of Stafford; daughter, Maxine Phelan and husband, Herb, of Rosenberg.
