



Gertrude Jane (Gaidosik) Hall

June 12, 1922 - February 2, 2018

Gertrude Jane Hall was born June 12, 1922, to Joseph and Josephine Gaidosik in Sparks, Oklahoma. The family moved to Needville, Texas on a farm while Gertrude was still just a youngster. They grew cotton and raised some livestock. There were many tales of her growing up years on the farm with her many siblings. In 1942, she married Luke Hall Jr. In 1944, while Luke, Jr. was serving his country Luke Hall III was born. When Luke Jr. got out of the Merchant Marines they spent their early married life in Sharon, MA. and after traveling to several other states they settled in Richmond, TX.

Gertrude worked at Davis Motor Company for a while then landed a job with Gulf States Tube and there she worked until retirement. She was known for her feistiness. In her job interview it is told that her reply to why she should be hired was "I'm going to work somewhere so it might as well be here."

Gertrude loved to sew, bake, and can her vegetables that she grew in her garden. When she could not work in a garden anymore she got cucumbers, fruit and cabbage from markets and canned her famous dill pickles, jelly, and sauerkraut. She baked 4 to 6 loaves of bread every week that she shared with her family and her kolaches and cinnamon rolls were to die for. Sewing though was something she was passionate about. She has made some of the most magnificent quilts that were ever made. Each family member has one of her quilts and some more than one. She made robes for each of her

grandchildren and her great grandchildren and sewed clothes for herself even into her mid 90's.

She was preceded in death by her parents Joe and Josephine, her husband Luke, Jr and her siblings, Alfred Gaidosik, Alfonse Gaidosik, Russell Gaidosik, Matylde Butler, Emily Von Cannon, Leonard Gaidosik, Frances Molina, Julie Hubenak, Pauline Skravanik, Annie Matak, Mary Gregurek, Lucy Bushnell, Johnny Gaidosik, William Gaidosik, Pete Gaidosik, and (baby) Stephanie Gaidosik.

She is survived by her son Luke Hall III, wife Marsha. Her grandchildren Marc, wife Kimberly, Shelly Chambers, husband Matthew, and Amanda Host, husband Ryan. Her great- grandchildren Nicholas Hall, Tatum and Griffin Chambers, and Cole, Levi and Jase Host.
