A Memorial Service for Glenn Hergenrader, 57, of Richmond, Texas, formerly of La Porte, Texas will be held at 2:00 P.M., Sunday, February 11, 2007 in the Chapel of Davis-Greenlawn Funeral Home in Rosenberg, Texas.

Glenn was born December 24, 1949 in Lincoln, Nebraska to Victor and Mary Jacobs Hergenrader. He played football for the University of Nebraska where he received his Bachelor's Degree. Glenn served in the U.S. Air Force and was a member of the American Legion. He belonged to the Greater Houston Coaches Association and the Texas High School Coaches Association. He loved spending time with his children and grandsons, fishing and barbecuing. Glenn also loved mentoring, motivating and being a role model for children. He coached at 8 different schools across Texas and 2 schools in Nebraska. He passed away February 7, 2007 in Sugar Land, Texas.

He is preceded in death by his parents, Victor and Mary Hergenrader.
