James Jean Kocian, Sr., 73, loving husband, father, grandfather, brother and friend to all, passed away on Sunday, September 13, 2009, after a brief illness.

A 1956 graduate of Texas A&M University, Jim earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemical Engineering. He was commissioned upon graduation as a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Army and was stationed in Anniston, Ala. Jim then began a lifelong career in the energy field by accepting a position with Union Carbide. He moved into a management capacity there before moving on to Kaneb Services, Inc. Jim eventually became chairman, CEO and part-owner of a coal company, Ikerd-Bandy, Inc., in Kentucky, as well as numerous other entrepreneurial ventures.

Away from the office, Jim was a proud, longtime member of the Petroleum Club of Houston, Fort Bend Country Club in Richmond and the American Institute of Chemical Engineers.
