



## Johnny B. Scott

October 1, 1921 - September 10, 2020

Johnny Boyd Scott (1921-2020) graduated in the first class of The University of Houston School of Pharmacy in 1950 and was known by the Rosenberg community as “the friendly neighborhood Pharmacist” at Schaffer’s Pharmacy for more than 30 years. Years after he retired and let his license expire, the Texas State Board of Pharmacy surprised Johnny with an honorary registered pharmacist license.

During World War II, Johnny served as a Navy Lieutenant dive bomber pilot in the Pacific Theatre. He was a dedicated family man who enjoyed fishing, watching movies and working in his yard. As man of deep faith, he was a lifelong member of St. John's United Church of Christ and served in various leadership roles, including serving on the consistory. Johnny was adored by everyone who met him, and he will be missed.

Johnny is survived by his wife of 71 years, Mildred Walzel Scott, his four children; David (Debbie), DeAnn Englert (Mike), Ricky (Brenda), and Lori Cowdery (Kirke), 6 grandchildren; Brandon, Hayleigh, Ashleigh, Jamie, Candace and Scott and 1 great-grandson; James. He is preceded in death by his parents: Howard Scott and Willie Chambers; and his two older brothers; Howard Jr. and Willie.
