Josephine Zamora Castillo went to be with God on Thursday, March 22, 2012. Born in Hungerford, Texas, in 1922, she celebrated her 90th birthday on Monday, March 19th. Born to Teodoro Zamora and Matilde Cabrera, Josie was the ninth of eleven children.

Having outlived all her siblings, she was preceded in death by brothers Felix, Hernan, Teodoro, Jr., Trinidad and Estevan Zamora. Her sisters were Guadalupe Morales, Amalia Saenz, Juanita Zamora, Beatrice Martinez and Cesaria Sara Sosa.

They were faithful parishioners of Holy Rosary and St. John Fisher Catholic churches having been one of the original families to support the foundation of St. John Fisher in the early 1950's.
