He was very active in his parish community, St. Augustine Syro Malabar Forane Church, as a trustee and parish council member for over 30 years. He coordinated the construction of a new college, auditorium, and church in Ramapuram. Thomakutty was also heavily invested in local politics as a congress representative. He served his town by contributing to the development of invaluable and much-needed infrastructure projects, such as the Vellilappilly-Kondadu road, the Community Hall road, and the Menamparambil River bridge. Adding on to his philanthropic endeavours, Thomakutty was the leader of the Vincent-DePaul Society, which constructed multiple homes for the homeless. After Thomakutty's first trip to America in 1995, he grew to love the Houston environment and knew Texas was destined to be the new home for himself and his family. In 2008 Thomakutty permanently migrated to Houston, fulfilling his American Dream of being close to family in an environment ripe with possibilities. His passions included, gardening, martial arts, hosting parties, and volleyball. His friendliness and kindness for all people, as well as his love for nature, is a tribute to the purity of his soul. Every day he expressed his incredible capacity for love and caring

to everyone he met. If anyone confided in any difficulties that they were struggling with, Thomakutty would make sure to pray for them, expressing his deep belief in the miracle work of St. Augustine and St. Anthony. His boisterous personality and silly jokes will be deeply missed by those who had the privilege of knowing him.
