Lanny was a proud father to Amanda and Bobby (Amber), and a doting grandfather to Elijah, Jonah, Mia, as well as his two granddogs, Luna and Lucy. Lanny is preceded in death by his parents, Beulah Ulia Unis Creek Brown and Leo A. Brown, and siblings Larry Brown (Christine), Lonnie Brown, and LaRay Brown (Ann). His surviving siblings are Laura Welch, Linda Heathcock, Leatha (Jim).

Although he wouldn't admit it, Lanny had an artistic side and didn't shy away from expressing his creativity.
