For those wishing, memorial donations may be made to the Needville Church of Christ.

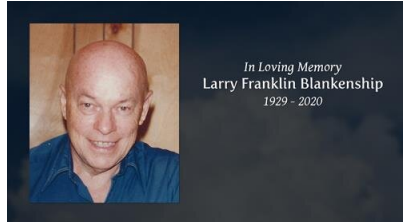
