



## Lawrence B. Laskoskie

March 17, 1933 - June 1, 2011

A funeral mass for Lawrence B. Laskoskie, 78, of Richmond, Texas will be held at 10 a.m., Monday, June 6, 2011 at Holy Rosary Catholic Church, 1416 George, Rosenberg, Texas. Interment, with military honors will follow at Greenlawn Memorial Park in Rosenberg. Father William D. Bartniski will officiate the services.

Visitation will be from 3:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m., followed by a rosary at 5:00 p.m., Sunday, June 5, 2011 at Holy Rosary Catholic Church in Rosenberg.
