



Louis M. Losack

August 30, 1928 - March 23, 2013

Funeral mass for Louis M. Losack, 84, of East Bernard, will be held at 3:00 p.m., Wednesday, March 27, 2013 at Holy Cross Catholic Church in East Bernard with Fr. Don Ruppert officiating. Interment, with military honors, will follow at Holy Cross Cemetery in East Bernard.

Visitation will be held from 4:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m., on Tuesday, March 26, 2013 at Holy Cross Catholic Church. The rosary will be recited at 6:00 p.m.

A second time of visitation will be from 12:00 noon until service time at 3:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 27, 2013 at Holy Cross Catholic Church.

Louis was born on August 30, 1928 in Orchard, Texas to John and Martha Lisiecki Losack. He honorably served our country in the United States Marine Corp. Louis served in the Korean War in the Battle of the Chosin Reservoir. He was one of the few remaining members of the Gulf Coast Chapter of the Chosin Few. After returning from Korea, Louis met his wife Daisy, a marine, at Camp Pendleton and they were married at the Ranch House Chapel. Over the past 30 years Louis was well known in the East Bernard area for his yard and tree trimming business. Many of the beautiful oak trees in and around East Bernard were at one time trimmed and sculpted by Louis. He was a member of Holy Cross Catholic Church in East Bernard. He passed away at his home in East Bernard on March 23, 2013.

He is preceded in death by his parents, John and Martha Losack; and siblings, Catherine Phillips, Johnnie Losack, Tom Losack, Charlie Losack, Leona Jackson and Donald Losack.

Louis is survived by his wife of 60 years, Daisy Stoll Losack; daughter, Elizabeth Ann Sims and husband, Steven; son, Dustan M. Losack and wife, Melissa; grandchildren, Rebecca, David, Sarah, Michael and Samuel Sims, and Dustan M. "DJ" Jr. and Landon Losack; brothers, Joseph Losack and wife, Linda and Jimmie Losack and wife, Georgie; brother-in-law, Larry Jackson; sister-in-law, Evelyn Losack; along with numerous nieces, nephews, other family members and friends.
