Lucille Stewart Jackson, 85, of Richmond, Texas went to be with the Lord on Friday, November 14, 2014 at 8:05 p.m.

She was born January 17, 1929 in Richmond, Texas. The daughter of the late Andrew and Nora Stewart. She was their 4th child and has 10 siblings. Mrs. Jackson grew up in Fort Bend County. She joined Oak Hill Missionary Baptist Church over 70 years ago. She was highly committed and dedicated in working with the church.
