Margaret Ruth Margie Kovar, 80, passed away in Houston, TX, on Wednesday, October 17, 2012.

Miss Kovar was born on March 21, 1932, in Snook, TX, the daughter of the late Frank and Mary Minnie Vajdak Kovar of Beasley, TX. Her sister Alice Mae Lively and brother-in-law Everett Doyle Lively also preceded her in death. Survivors include two sisters: Mary Ann Birkhead and husband Roy Birkhead, of Huntsville, TX, and Clara Crumbly and husband Kenneth Crumbly, of Williamsburg, VA.
