Mariano (Jay) S. Alaniz, Jr., 71, of Mission, Texas, passed peacefully at Houston Methodist of The Woodlands Hospital in the early morning Thursday, November 4, 2021, after an 18-year battle with idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis. Jay was born in 1949, or “Al” as he was known by his colleagues, was 5 days shy of celebrating his 72nd birthday on November 9th. His interests and talents were vast and varied. A natural athlete with a fondness for music, affection for animals, and a life-long obsession with automobiles.

Jay married his childhood sweetheart and the love of his life, Ana Maria Cavazos, in his hometown of San Antonio, Texas in the Summer of 1966 where they raised a family of four. 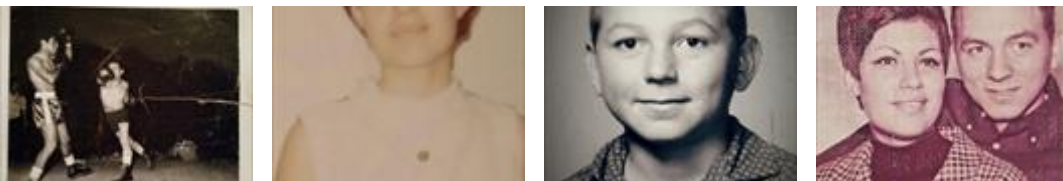
