Marion August Teykl, 94, of Needville, Texas, passed away peacefully December 11, 2025, surrounded by his loving family. He was born on August 14, 1931, near Snake Creek in Fort Bend County, Texas, to August and Lillie (Kunetka) Teykl.

Marion was a faithful servant and a lifetime member of St. Paul's Presbyterian Church, a member of the 2nd Infantry Division in the US Army, Korean War Veteran's Alliance, Needville Blue Jay Quarterback Club and Needville Little League Baseball Association.

MT, affectionately labeled by friends, farmed in younger years, enjoyed cars and horses, worked for Ladd Stavinoha, Texas Gulf Sulfur, was lead tank driver and Platoon Sergeant in the Korean War '52-'54 and Meat Market Manager at Henke's and lastly Kroger for 31 years.

Marion married the love of his life on November 13, 1954, and then devoted himself to his 4 children, 10 grandchildren and ultimately 13 great-children in their extracurricular activities. He could be found watching sports most days and could rattle off the weather conditions without hesitation. During Shirley and Marion's 71 years together, they spent time at their "honey hole" in Sargent, TX fishing, shrimping and relaxing at the beach. They traveled to Mexico, Alaska, the Panama Canal, the Caribbean and Niagara Falls. Marion

adored his wife, kids, and loved spending time with his grandkids at Teykl Fest, in the backyard or rocking them to sleep, offering some “medicine” (stick of gum) or ChapStick. MT was a loyal friend, had an uncanny sense of humor and displayed the utmost integrity conjoined with a gentle, generous heart. Marion prided himself in being groundskeeper for St. Paul’s Church and Needville Little League for 10 years. He was famous for his sausage making, bar-b-queing, an immaculate garden and manicured yard.

In addition to his parents, Marion was preceded in death by son Brian Teykl and his siblings Joyce Fojtik Robison and Charles Teykl.
