Marjorie Cecil Covell was born October 31, 1915 to William and Cecil Covell of Richmond. William Covell was one of the original founders of Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Richmond. Marjorie graduated second in her class from Richmond High School. She later moved to New Orleans where she met and married Dennis Barrett on October 25, 1941. Dennis joined the navy during WWII and the couple was stationed in California. After the war, they moved to Richmond, where Marjorie was a housewife, mother, girl scout leader, boy scout leader, bridge player, and church volunteer. She and Dennis were happily married for 58 years until his death from cancer in 1999. Marjorie was a wonderful wife, mother, grandmother and great grandmother. She passed away March 24, 2010.

She is preceded in death by her husband, Dennis Barrett, Sr.; son, Dennis Barrett, Jr.; parents, William Nelson and Cecil Brupbacher Covell; brother, William Covell; and sisters, Emma Marie Covell and Doris Escobar.
