Michael Joseph Moser, Jr. was born March 13, 1970, in Austin, Texas. He was the son of Kristine Knolle Moser and Michael Joseph Moser, Sr. Michael grew up in Houston in the Sharpstown neighborhood where he attended Saint Francis de Sales Catholic School.

Michael was a proud graduate of Strake Jesuit College Preparatory, Houston, Texas. During summer breaks while in college, he interned at Fulbright & Jaworski where he developed an interest in studying law. He graduated from Loyola University, New Orleans, Louisiana with a degree in Business Administration. While an undergraduate at Loyola he met and subsequently married his wife Patricia (Trish) Rupp Moser. He worked for a New Orleans law firm while he attended Loyola University Law School at night, eventually earning his Juris Doctor degree. Michael and Trish loved New Orleans; however, Hurricane Katrina destroyed their home and forced them to move to Florida.

While attending law school he developed an interest in the telecommunications industry. That interest evolved into a career as a project manager for several companies, including Goodman Networks and Nokia. He spent his career managing the construction of cellular networks infrastructure. While working for Nokia he earned the designation as a Certified Project Manager (CPM). At Nokia, he managed projects for the major cellular

companies and for the Department of Defense and the National Security Agency.

Michael was a person of quick wit and many talents. He was well-read and an astute analyst of politics, history and world events. The unique architectural beauty of Houston's skyline stimulated his interest in photography. As a self-taught chef and admirer of New Orleans cuisine, he loved to create elaborate meals for family and friends.

Michael is survived by his parents and his brother David Moser and wife Symbol along with their children Brennan and Cole. He is also survived by his former wife Patricia Rupp Moser and numerous aunts, uncles and cousins.
