Mildred Palat Seiler was born on February 10, 1922, near Needville, Texas to Joseph Palat and Frances Syptak Palat. She passed away on January 18, 2011 at the age of 88, in the Austin home of her son, Larry. Mildred graduated with honors from Richmond High School. She then graduated from Massey Business College in Houston.

In March 1941 she married Leroy Seiler and they began their life journey together. They celebrated their 66th wedding anniversary together in 2009 two days before Leroy passed away.
