Patricia Ann (Furth) Trahan died peacefully at home Thursday, January 25, 2018. Pat was born April 4, 1933, in Chicago, Illinois, and was the second daughter of Matthew and Rose Furth. She was preceded in death by her husband of 38 years, Theo R. Trahan.
