Patrick Bernard Ryan, 59, went home to be with the Lord on Monday morning, January 11, 2010. His beloved family was by his side.

Pat was born on March 17, 1950, in Staten Island, New York. He and Sherry Wechtenhiser were married on January 30, 1971, in Houston, Texas and had three children. He worked as a machinist for 40 years and was currently employed with Compressor Products, Inc. He was a lifelong Christian man who never wavered in his faith.
