Raul was a loving husband and grandfather who was born in Edinburg, Texas on July 10, 1924 to Abelina and Juan Trevino. He enlisted into the Army on August 17, 1944, where he served with Company E, 314 Infantry Regiment, and 79TH Infantry Division. He received a Campaign Ribbon with 2 Bronze Stars, a Good Conduct Medal, Victory Ribbon, and the Army of Occupation Ribbon in Germany where he fought during WWII in the Rhineland Central Europe Campaign.

Upon his return to the states, he owned and operated his own Taxi Service in Edinburg for a few years while the family grew. In 1960, he took a job with the Texas Department of Corrections TDC and moved the family to Sugar Land where the family lived in a rent house until he had his house constructed.

Once the house was built, he moved the family into the home where he raised and provided for 6 children. He retired from TDC at age 55 and lived a great life with his daughters, sons, grandchildren, and great grandchildren.

A celebration of his life will be held Tuesday, June 12, 2012 at 10:00 AM in the Chapel at Davis Greenlawn funeral Home. Burial will follow in Greenlawn Memorial Park.

Visitation will be Monday evening, June 11, 2012 from 4-8 PM in the Chapel at Davis Greenlawn Funeral Home with a Rosary at 7 PM.
