



Rose Cervenka

March 24, 1924 - November 3, 2015

Rose Cervenka was born in Nada, Texas, on March 24, 1924. She was the eighth of twelve children born to Frank Brenk and Mary Duyka Brenk. On May 17, 1949, she married Edward Cervenka in Holy Family Catholic Church in Wharton, Texas. In November of 1950, she and Edward moved from El Campo to Rosenberg. She was a member of Holy Rosary Catholic Church. During the centennial year of the church in 2011, Rose was one of the 100 most senior members of the parish.

Rose died on November 3, 2015, in Rosenberg. She was preceded in death by her husband Edward February 6, 1991 and her son Mark Wayne August 11, 2006. Also preceding her in death were her sisters, Frances Baca, Agnes Socha, Marie Boyd, Josephine Pavlovsky, and Cecilia Kucera; and her brothers, Frank Brenk, Anthony Brenk, Fred Brenk, Theodore Brenk, and Benjamin Brenk; and many extended family members.
