Funeral Mass for Roy M. Raska, 88, of Sugar Land, Texas will be held at 10:00 A.M. , Monday, December 15, 2008 at St. Theresa Catholic Church 115 7th St., in Sugar Land.

Interment will follow with Full Military Honors at Greenlawn Memorial Park in Rosenberg.

Roy was born March 8, 1920 in Buckholts to Anton J. and Pearl Zawadzke Raska and grew up in Needville. He served in the United States Army Air Corp during WWII. He worked at Sugar Land Industries before working at WKM for 27 years. Roy was a 3rd and 4th Degree Charter Member of the Knights of Columbus, and a member of the American Legion Post 271, St. Theresa's Sugar Canes and Sugar Land AARP. Roy enjoyed gardening, and his two cats, but the thing he loved and enjoyed the most was his family. He passed away December 12, 2008 in Sugar Land.
