A memorial service for Vinnie Lynette Lynn Thompson, 83, of Claxton, Georgia and formerly of Rosenberg, will be held at 2:00 P. M., Friday, September 10, 2010 at Davis-Greenlawn Funeral Chapel in Rosenberg.

Lynn, one of ten children in the Sikes family, was born January 15, 1927 in Manassas, Georgia to George Frank and Pearl Sikes. She passed away on September 1, 2010 in Claxton, Georgia.

She graduated from high school and attended the Candler School of Nursing in Savannah, Georgia. She graduated and became part of the Army Cadet Nurse Corps during World War II. The war ended shortly after her graduation and she did not see action in the war.

Shortly after, she met and married her husband, George Thompson.

She worked at various hospitals in Georgia and Louisiana before settling in Rosenberg. She worked at Polly Ryon Memorial Hospital Oak Bend for 25 years where she was a labor and delivery nurse. She helped deliver many babies in Fort Bend County during those years. She was awarded Polly Ryon's Life Time Achievement Award in 2003, an award she was quite proud of.

Lynn was preceded in death by her husband, George Thompson, who was the general manager of KFRD Radio for many years and her daughter, Karen Thompson.

She is survived by her son, Gus Howard Thompson, of San Diego, California; her granddaughter, Cara Thompson Bryan and husband, Mark, of Minot, AFB, North Dakota; her grandson, Austin Thompson of Richmond; great grandson, James Thompson Bryan of North Dakota; and two sisters, Alene Moore and husband, Willie and Nell Surrency, both of Claxton, Georgia. She is also survived by many nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
