Virginia Mae Baidon Trewitt Guinn left her earthly home on May 26, 2010 in Richmond , Texas . Virginia was born in Cincinnati , Ohio on March 13, 1929, the only child of William Breck Baidon and Mary Elizabeth Cole. Virginia moved to Texas with her mother after her parents divorced.
