Wilbur Charles Miller, 71, of Richmond, TX, passed away December 5, 2011. He was born June 26, 1940 to Hiram M. and Mary E. Miller of Hanna City, IL. He graduated from Farmington High School in 1958. On December 27, 1964, he married Ova G. Puckett.

Wilbur grew up on a farm. He began working off the farm for the Peoria County Highway Department. He served in the US Army Reserve. He gravitated to law enforcement starting with the Norwood Police Department, moving on to Hanna City, IL, Skokie, IL, Fort Myers, FL, and concluding as Chief of Police in Clewiston, FL.

He moved back to work on the family farm briefly in the early '80s before moving to Texas to work for the Texas Department of Corrections. He started in maintenance and in time transferred into the new Health, Safety, and Environment Department at the Jester Units outside of Richmond, TX, where he worked until his retirement. He cut an imposing figure with boots, white shirt, and green hard hat standing over 6 feet.

He was an NRA Life Member, member of the World Safety Organization, and Fort Bend County Fire Fighters Association.

He enjoyed collecting Caterpillar and farm tractor models, playing with his

model trains, and working with his Kubota tractor.

He was preceded in death by his parents and brother Harmie. Survived by his wife of 46 years Ova, children Charles, Chan and wife, Griselda, and Chad; his sister Martha Eberley.
