William H. Lucky, Jr., born on August 24, 1931 in Heidenheimer, Texas, passed away on January 9, 2012 in Rosenberg, Texas.

He is a graduate of Temple High School and Baylor University, which he attended on a football scholarship. He later received a Masters of Art from Prairie View A&M.

He briefly played professional football for the Green Bay Packers and Toronto Argonauts. He met his wife in Green Bay and later they moved to Texas, where he began working in the public schools, teaching and coaching. In 1969 he moved to Rosenberg, where he served as Head Football Coach and Athletic Director at Lamar CISD, and he finished his career there as Director of Maintenance and Grounds.

Over the years, Bill touched the lives of many people. He loved spending time with his wife and children, and especially his grandchildren. He learned carpentry in his youth and the passion stayed with him throughout his life. His love of sports never abated.

He is preceded in death by his parents, William H Lucky, Sr. and Mary Beall Lucky, his son, Mark, and Father-in-law and Mother-in-law Oskar and Ellen Bakkom.

He is survived by his wife, Patricia; his children Robert Lucky and wife Lisa, Lee Ann Lucky, Lu Beth Cloudt and husband Ray, and Luke Lucky and wife Teri; his grandchildren Aubrey Tritico, Gayla, Wade and Dalton Cloudt, Gavin Lucky, Drifter, Brinley and Lawson Lucky; his brother Donald Wayne Lucky and wife Sue; brother-in-law and sister-in-law James and Gail Bakkom; and a host of relatives and friends.

He was replaced by Bill Lucky who had stories about making the Green Bay Packer roster. He related how making the Packer team meant going one-on-one with the other last man standing. In the first meeting with our team he said that we would not be expected to do anything that he hadn't been through! He was wearing his Green Bay Packer jacket and we were apprehensive to say the least! I can't remember whether he made an under-performing part of our team buy tickets to one of our games and enter with fans...or whether he just threatened to do that, but his insistence on accountability was a lesson that has stuck. He ran sprints with the team he was fast but then told us the fat kicker Lou "the Toe" Groza beat him in a 40 yard dash at a Green Bay practice! Bill Lucky was a good and honest man. All the boys he worked with are better men for the experience.
